Pursuant to the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) of 1996 and the Programmatic Regulations for the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan, the South Florida Ecosystem Restoration Task Force (Task Force) can seek input on restoration activities from knowledgeable parties, stakeholders, and the public [Sec. 528(f)(3)(B) of Public Law 104-303] and can provide formal feedback to the US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) on restoration planning and implementation efforts [33 CFR Part 385.10(e)]. At the May 19, 2021 Working Group/Science Coordination Group meeting, the Corps requested a workshop to seek public input on the 2021 update of the Integrated Delivery Schedule (IDS). The Working Group voted unanimously to provide the requested support on this and future workshops.
