# Background

- The Task Force and the Science Coordination Group (SCG) have a long history of coordination on restoration science.
- The Task Force's Plan for Coordinating Science outlines how they coordinate science; 1 way is through scientific and technical workshops hosted by the SCG.
- The SCG hosted a Post Hurricane Irma Workshop in 2017.
- Hopeful that the many subsequent activities were inspired or enhanced because of that workshop.

### Workshop Format

This workshop is designed to provide a forum to:
Share information on Post Hurricane Ian science.
Increase collaboration and coordination opportunities.
Highlight any tools or resources that are available.
In addition to the Zoom Webinar, today's workshop is being webcast live and recorded.

## Workshop Format

- Four different ways to participate in today's Zoom Webinar:
  - 1. <u>Whip Around/Researcher Engagement</u>: Each attendee will be called on one at a time to discuss any hurricane related science they want to provide, including past hurricane science.
  - 2. <u>Public Comment</u>: Oral comments can be provided at the conclusion of the workshop with the Raise Hand feature.
  - 3. <u>Roundtable Discussion</u>: Workshop attendees may use the Raise Hand feature to be called on and unmuted to discuss relevant post Hurricane Ian research, monitoring, or other science.
  - 4. <u>Chat Feature</u>: Attendees may use the Chat feature to share information like websites, contact information, and other resources.


#### 1. Whip Around/Researcher Engagement

- The workshop moderators will call on attendees 1 at a time.
- Please tell everyone about science you are doing post Hurricane lan or other post hurricane science you have done in the past. Please be succinct so we can hear from everyone.
- The moderators will try to allow for 1 or 2 questions or comments via the Raise Hand feature unless time runs short.



## 2. Public Comment via Raise Hand

- At the beginning of the Public Comment period, click the Raise Hand icon at the bottom of your screen if you'd like to speak.
- The host will be notified that you've raised your hand.



#### 2. Public Comment via Raise Hand

- The host will call on individuals wishing to speak.
- Your microphone will be unmuted for you.
- A timer will appear on-screen.
- Please keep your comments to the time allowed.


## 3. Roundtable Discussion
