



Lisa Lynne Russell is a career Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the Environment and Natural Resources Division of the United States Department of Justice. Ms. Russell supervises litigation arising under a broad range of land and resource management statutes, water rights and water allocation matters, Fifth Amendment takings claims, and litigation brought by Indian Tribes and individuals relating to the United States' Indian trust responsibility. Ms. Russell also supervises the ENRD Executive Office and advises the Assistant Attorney General on issues ranging from the budget, human resources, information and technology management, and administrative services. Before joining ENRD's Office of the Assistant Attorney General in 2022, Ms. Russell was Chief of the Natural Resources Section for eleven years. In ENRD, Ms. Russell also has held positions as Acting Deputy Assistant Attorney General, Senior Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General, and Assistant Chief of the Wildlife and Marine Resources Section. From 2009 – 2011, Ms. Russell served as the Department of the Interior's Deputy Solicitor for Parks and Wildlife, where she advised the Office of the Secretary, Solicitor, and Interior Bureau Directors on legal issues arising under federal wildlife laws and statutes and regulations governing the management of the National Park System. Ms. Russell received her J.D. from Washington University School of Law and clerked for the Honorable Nathaniel R. Jones of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit.
